### Joint Statement on Responsible Purchasing Practices amid the COVID-19 Crisis

April 2020

During this unprecedented time of global outbreak of the COVID-19, responsible business has become more important than ever for the whole world to survive and recover from the crisis. Especially, responsible purchasing practices of brand companies, retailers and traders of the global textile and apparel supply chains, will bring enormous impacts on the fundamental rights of millions of workers and the livelihood of their families in the supplier end. It is time for global business to uphold and honor their commitment to labor rights, social responsibility and sustainable supply chains.

With this in mind, we, the undersigned nine textile and garment business association of the Sustainable Textile of Asian Region (STAR) Network from six producing and export countries, hereby call on global brand companies, retailers and trade to:

- 1. Carefully consider all potential impacts on workers, small business in the supply chain when taking significant purchasing decision;
- 2. Honor the terms of purchasing contracts, fulfill obligations therein, and not re-negotiate price or payment terms;
- 3. Make practical plans to take responsibility of the suspended delivery or shipment, as well as the goods already produced or currently in production, proceed with payment as agreed upon, and not cancel confirmed orders which are already in production;
- 4. Offer fair compensation to suppliers (100% FOB) if production or delivery has to be suspended or stopped, or offer salaries directly to workers of supplies;
- 5. Put no responsibility on supplies for delay of delivery or shipment and claim no compensation for such delays;
- 6. Put no further improper pressure on supplies by additional costs, rush orders or unnecessary visits and audits;
- 7. Make all efforts and engage with local stakeholders for a better understanding of the local situation and contexts;
- 8. Always resort to dialogue and collaborative settlement to ensure mutually acceptable solutions to disputes;
- 9. Support business partners on supply chain as much as possible, and aim aat long-term strategy of business continuity, supply chain unity and social sustainability;

We appreciate the understanding, collaboration and support of our business partners and other stakeholder, and we are ready to work and walk with all responsible buyers globally to get through this crisis, towards a shared bright future.

# EU MyanKu Fund by management of UNOPS and implanted by SMART Textiles & Garments

"EU Myan Ku Fund" managed by UNOPS and implemented by SMART Textile & Garments, aimed to support for factory workers of garment/footwear and bags factories who are suspended or terminated due to the consequence economic effect of COVID 19, is now available. "EU MyanKu" provides the direct cash transfers to terminated and laid-off garment workers, to help them through the months of May, June and July. The payments are disbursed through Wave Money with 3 reasons which are 1) to workers in crisis who are jobless and/or face eviction from their homes, 2) to workers whose contracts were illegally terminated, thereby also countering

irresponsible practices, and 3) to workers of Small and Medium Enterprises (SMEs) who agree to retain workers and to provide at

least a matching support. Myan Ku is financed through the EU's Humanitarian Development Peace Nexus Response Mechanism(NRM), managed by UNOPS and is coordinated by the EU's SMART Textile & Garments project team and their affiliated partners and associates, especially the Myanmar Garment Manufacturers Association(MGMA), the Confederation of Trade Unions Myanmar (CTUM), the Centre for Economic and Social Development (CESD) and several local civil society organization and NGOs. 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#### Recommendation to member factories

18 April 18, 2020

#### Subjecti

- To follow the command and control orders of COVID -19 as reopening factories after Thingyan Water Festival, recommend giving leave to whom cannot come back to work due to the various reasons and give the employment guarantee
- To control the current epidemic of COVID-19, Yangon Region Government has released the statement date of 2.4.2020 and reported to the District Township Working Committee of COVID-19 protect, control, care to cooperate the restriction plan by staying home during Thingyan Water Festival Holidays (April 10 to 19,2020).
- 2. And the Ministry of Health and Sports released the Notification No.37/2020 which described the restriction of not to gather 5 or more people except 9 facts including 'Employees who are working back and forth to factory/company'. In the Notification, it described that 'If there is a lack of the orders and instruction which is released by the Ministry of Health and Sports regarding COVID-19, the action will be taken to those according to the Infectious Disease Prevention Act.
- To reduce the economic impact and lose of employment by the effect of COVID-19 epidemic, Myanmar Garment Manufacturers Association (MGMA) is in cooperation with
  - China Textile & Garment Association In Myanmar(CTGAIM)
  - Korea Garment Association In Myanmar (KOGAM)
  - Group of Japan Garment Manufacturers in Myanmar

#### And recommend our factories members

- To follow Prevention Guidelines of COVID-19 and Applicable law, Orders, and Instruction of COVID-19.
- To give the Unpaid leave from 20.4.2020 to 30.4.2020 if the worker report to the related factory or in charge person by phoning, messaging, Viber message, E-mail, etc... due to the situation of their region or themselves and to give the guarantee of their employment.

In order to save the production cost and other charges incurred by investors for their Investments which obtained the Permit or Endorsement or Foreign Direct Investment which are intended to invest in Myanmarduring the COVID-19 period, the Myanmar Investment Commission shall reduce 50 % of service fees from the date of 20th April, 2020 as follows:

- 2. Press to the 'ရယူလိုက်ပါ' And Download it.




- 3. Press 'Ok' to the question and install the application.

#### Republic of Union of Myanmar Ministry of Labour, Immigration and Population Minister Office Notification 83/2020 Nay Pyi Taw

7th Waxing of Kasone 1382 ME (28 April 2020)

- The Ministry of Labour, Immigration and Population announced on 19 April 2020 that factories, workplaces and work establishments need to follow recommendations and guidelines of Ministry of Health and Sports to reopen, as a move to contain the outbreak of Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19) after making inspections from 20 to 30 April.
- As per this announcement, some workplaces were temporarily closed, although they were scheduled to operate again on 20 April. Employees registered for Social security under Social Welfare Programme had no work temporarily from 20 April to the day of reopening.
- These employees could receive 40 per cent of their salaries based on insurance fee of the 1/2020 month for the unemployed days in accordance with the Social Security Law Section 13 (b) (2) and section 100.
- Employers of those registered factories, workplaces and work establishments may apply for social security benefits for workers, commencing the day when the announcement was issued.
- The announcement will take effect on the day when it was published.
