On August 28th, Chairman, Vice-Chairman, CECs and Managing Director of MGMA attended Roundtable Discussion at Intertextile Shanghai Apparel Fabrics - Autumn Edition 2023. Chairman of MGMA discussed the outline "How is digital transformation impacting the textile and clothing industry in terms of production processes, supply chain management, and customer experience" and presented about current production process practically approach in Myanmar garment industry.

Delegates from ASEAN Federation of Textile Industries (AFTEX) were discussed about "How sustainable supply chain and digital transformation support SDGs in Asia" by Myanmar, Cambodia, Vietnam, Singapore, Thailand, Indonesia, Laos and Philippine in the afternoon session. Then, AFTEX Delegates, Exhibitors and MGMA delegates were joined networking dinner of Intertextile night at InterContinental Shanghai Hongqiao Hotel.













MGMA Buyer Delegation visited 2 factories in Changshu, Jiangsu Province (One Stop Service Production from Textile to Garment) on August 29th. Visitors of MGMA members from Yangon, Mandalay and AFTEX delegates from Cambodia, Vietnam, Singapore, Thailand, Indonesia, Laos and Philippine accompanied to joined the factories' presentation. The two factories can produce fabric, dyeing and printing to clothing in one stop service production, and the production processes are carried out with Automatic Hunger System with latest technologies.



On August 30th, business matching with fabric producers and MGMA buyer delegates were sourcing needs of products by shown sample. Chairman and Managing Director of MGMA joined the interview section, organized by PR team of Messe Frankfurt Hong Kong about the Myanmar-China business relation with possible collaboration in future.

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MGMA Statement on its Commitment to keep improving the Myanmar Garment Sector after recent announcements made by some International Brands

25th August 2023

- The Myanmar Garment Manufacturers Association (MGMA) has recently learnt from a 17 August 2023 article on Reuters that H&M Group has "decided to gradually stop sourcing material from Myanmar." *
- MGMA is disheartened to see this unfortunate development. Such decisions will
 negatively impact the livelihoods of the employees in the supplying factories,
 including higher risk of mass lay-offs amid a challenging economic climate.
- Since its establishment in 2002, MGMA has worked with different stakeholders, development agencies, international partners and brands to improve the situation in Myanmar's garment factories.
- 4. Since February 2020, MGMA is implementing the Voluntary Labour Compliance Assessment (VLCA) to assess member factories' performance against national labour laws and international labour standards. An online version was launched in November 2022 in order to speed up assessments and expand enrolment. As of now, over 220 factories have been assessed successfully and around one hundred factories are under evaluation process.
- MGMA is discussing on further expanding cooperation towards constructively addressing labour and livelihood issues in the garment sector with all the related stakeholders.
- 6. MGMA has always advocated for international garment brands to maintain responsible partnerships with local and locally established garment factories. As the main sectoral association working on the ground and having seen firsthand the

negative impacts of similar exits in the early 2000s, MGMA strongly believes that international brands continued responsible presence in Myanmar will be the best way forward to maintain hard-earned gains made over the previous decade with regard to labour improvements alongside safeguarding the sector's vital role in providing dignified livelihoods for hundreds of thousands of mainly young women employees. A continued responsible partnership will serve to build up these gains continue the effort towards improving the local conditions in the current context.

- 7. As such, MGMA remains ready to work together with international brands and partners to responsibly continue business operations in Myanmar, and commits to keep improving the situation of the Myanmar garment sector for all stakeholders.

In this course, the trainer conducted parts of the fabric such as bag cover, spiral, shoulder corner seam, pocket, different types of bags, simple zip method, how to install a zipper, sewing sailor's tongue, long sleeve shirt and "A" skirt with belt. In addition, (6) special sewing method such as Buttonhole sewing machine, how to sew button using sewing machine, Bartack Machine, Overlock 4 thread, Overlock 5 thread, 2 Needle taught by trainers from MGHRDC with practice session. The training attended by (10) trainees.
